Families at Tadcaster Primary Academy were welcomed into the school's fabulous new library space which both children and staff have been working hard over the last few months to create.

This week we have attached an attendance postcard to the newsletter which has been published by our academy trust to remind families of the importance of good attendance. Already some of our children's attendance has fallen below 90% which means that their attendance will potentially be classed as persistent absentee level by the end of the school year. Persistent absence is tracked by the local authority and nationally by the Government. To avoid this happening we politely remind families not to take term time holidays and avoid booking medical appointments during the school day.

Payment for trips

As a school we are really struggling to make costs for trips that we carry out. In most cases we receive less than half of the contributions to cover the costs of coaches and the places we visit. As a result it means that school has to use budget that would normally go towards the running of the school. We always ask for a voluntary contribution and would welcome any small amount towards the cost if the amount requested can not be paid. We regularly subsidise our trips to ensure that the costs are not too high. In future we may have to cancel trips if we are unable to cover the majority of costs which we would really rather avoid. We would really appreciate your support in this matter.
