
Teaching for Mastery in maths

Over the last year the staff at Tadcaster Primary Academy have been working hard to develop an approach to maths which allows children to explore number and other aspects of mathematics by looking beyond calculation strategies. This is called '**teaching for mastery**' and this describes the elements of classroom practice and school organisation that combine to give pupils the best chances of mastering maths. Achieving **mastery** means acquiring a solid enough understanding of the maths that's been

taught to enable pupils to move on to more advanced material. Teaching for mastery approaches enable all pupils to succeed in maths.

At Tadcaster Primary we use concrete, pictorial, abstract (CPA) strategies to help children

understand maths. This means that initially children might learn the value of number using counters, dienes or even sticks to represent different numbers. This then moves onto using pictures and then the abstract which could be addition sums for example. Alongside this, our children are encouraged to solve problems and through a reasoning approach explain how they know the answer to a problem.



Since the summer term Mr Parkinson, our maths lead, has been looking at maths teaching within a teacher research group (TRG). This allows teachers to watch each other teach maths in different schools and take on new ideas and approaches. This great practice is then shared with the rest of our staff team through staff meetings.

As part of our academy trust's professional development, a group of Headteachers, including Miss Towler, have been invited to see this approach in further detail by visiting Shanghai, China. Shanghai is very much at the forefront of the mastery approach. From Thursday 17th October to Saturday 26th October, Miss Towler will be in Shanghai visiting schools and looking at the great maths practice going on there. The cost of the trip will be funded by grants and the academy trust, therefore not affecting our school budget. During this time if you should have any queries please consult with Mrs Bartlett, who is a member of the senior leadership team. School will also be supported by Mr Justin Reeve (Headteacher at Tockwith Primary, which is also a member of Ebor Academy Trust).


