
Try our delicious school dinners!

Parent Voice - our questionnaire

As we shared before Christmas, we have analysed the results for our Parent Voice survey which 29 of our families completed. The results below show lots of positives about how we are doing as a school. Thank you once again for completing the survey and for the positive comments we received, many of which we shared in our last newsletter and some of which we have added to our school entrance display.

From the responses received we have identified that communication about both what the children are learning and how your child is doing in their learning is something we could further develop. We will really focus on making sure families feel they are clear about both these aspects in the coming weeks. As you will know much of the reporting about your child's understanding of learning comes from the parent's evening meetings we hold twice a year and the end of year school report. In terms of what the children are learning we are working very hard to develop our creative curriculum this year and so in our weekly newsletters we have shared information regarding this but will definitely be sharing more very shortly.
