Learning all about our inner chimp!



On Thursday 22nd April we are excited to share that the children in Years 3,4,5 and 6 will each have a session with Kimberley Blakey from an organisation called Chimp Management. Children's mental health has never been as crucial given the challenges that everyone has faced over the past year. Chimp Management is all about supporting schools and children as much as possible with this. Kimberley will be delivering a 'Me and My Chimp' workshop at Tadcaster Primary

Academy to students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. This interactive workshop will introduce students to the Chimp Model and help them to understand why they might experience feelings such as anxiety, anger or worry. They will also explore some helpful strategies which can help them to manage these emotions and improve their overall wellbeing. As you know, at TPA we put a great deal of importance on children's emotional wellbeing and helping them understand their emotions and are sure that they will gain a lot from the session.



What are your children learning this term?



Eureka!

Our whole school topic this term is called **Eureka**. Each of the class teams has a different focus as part of this topic but this term there is a big drive on all things Science related. Please see a message from your child's class teacher below to find out more about what your children will be learning throughout the curriculum. One of the highlights of this term's topic will be our Science week which will take place the first

week back after half term. We can't wait!!

Team Reception

Over the coming weeks we can't wait to learn all about 'Minibeasts, mess and magic'. We will be finding, categorising and observing minibeasts and learning all about their habits and habitats! We will also be finding out about the world's largest and weirdest minibeasts. We will be engaging in some super science experiments to develop our thinking and explaining




skills so watch out for lots of exploding, dissolving, diving and colour changing as we explore the magic of science!



Team Jupiter (Y1/2)

In Key Stage One our focus for this term will be focused on EUREKA! A science themed topic looking at different material and their uses including recycling. We will also look into the past and explore The Great Fire of London. Our Geography learning will take us to hot and cold countries and we will investigate the Equator and the



North and South Poles. In our Design Technology work we will look at using different materials to make joins and have an egg drop challenge competition! We will look at sculpture in Art and our Computing continues with more coding and debugging of algorithms. In PE, we will learn and improve our tennis skills.

Team Saturn (Y3/4)

This term we will be having a major focus on Science as part of our whole school EUREKA topic. We will be covering Forces and Magnets, Sound and States of Matter. Within these topics we will conduct exciting experiments, investigations and just doing some things for fun. These will include a toyologist challenge, floating



paper clips, vibration stations, a window water cycle and Mars Bar cake!! In History we will be learning



about the Anglo Saxons including Alfred the Great. As part of the Geography topic we will look at different climate zones, rivers, mountains and lines of latitude, through our focus on Japan. Our RE focus will look at right and wrong through Christianity and Buddhism. In our PSHE topic we will be looking at the five ways to wellbeing and making pledges



to achieve these. This will also link in with our PE, where we will be taking part in different athletics events and playing cricket.

Team Neptune (Y5/6)

In our Creative Curriculum topic we are learning about Volcanoes and Earthquakes in Physical Geography as well as locating countries and continents in World Geography using Latitude and Longitude. We are learning about the Ancient Greeks as our main History topic. Our topic will include Art where we will be designing Greek pots using images from Mythology and geometric patterns. We will be reading some Greek myths and in DT we will be preparing some modern Greek food and finding out about designers who have

been inspired by Ancient Greece. In English our class books will be Boy in the Tower and The Legend of Podkin One Ear. We will be reading and writing poetry - In the Library of... Writing stories and character descriptions based on an amazing picture book called The Watertower, writing discussion texts about Greece and Sparta and Explanation texts describing how some "cracking contraptions" work. In Science we will be building on earlier work on Solids, Liquids and Gases looking at Properties and Changes of Materials with the emphasis on practical investigations and active learning with hopefully some awe and wonder mixed in too!
