
Our school attendance target is 97%.

#### Our vision and values

We have been exploring what we want for our school in the future and in our Parent Forum we asked parents to share which values they thought were important for our school. We had some great ideas and it was a really productive discussion.



Please see below to see what parents and carers shared was important to them:

Respect and Kindness - parents felt it was important for their child to be taught kindness/respect as one of our values of the school.

**Brave/Courageous** - One parent felt these were good values to teach the children to take safe risks, explore and to put themselves out there to reach their goals.

Some parents felt the word 'achieve' makes them think of children who are good at academic subjects and 'score well in a test' and would prefer an alternative word choice.

Curiosity - this was mentioned as being important to parents as they felt it was important to be curious to help children become lifelong learners.

**Resilience** was important to parents as they felt children needed to be able to take on challenges and be able to use their voice to articulate their feelings and emotions.
