## Moving on up year groups! What is happening next week for Transition?

Next Wednesday and Thursday our Year 6 children will visit Tadcaster Grammar School. For our current Reception to Year 5 children, they will arrive as normal to their classrooms and then will be taken to their new classes after registration. Reception will go to Year 1 (Team Jupiter) with Mr Ramzan and Mrs Bairstow and will be taught alongside the current Year 1 pupils who will become the new Year 2. The current Year 2 children will move to Team Saturn with Mr Parkinson, Miss Bell and the current Year 3 children. Year 4 and the current Year 5 will be with Mr Sands in Team Neptune.

In the afternoon, Swimming for the current Year 5 will take place as normal with Mr Sands and Miss Bell. The new Year 5 (current Year 4) will have an afternoon with Miss Blythe. The new Year 1 and the new Year 2 children will have Art and Music sessions with Mrs Brooke and Mrs Oldfield as will the new Year 3 and Year 4 children

From 11am our new Reception cohort will be invited to come into school for a stay and play session with their parents. This will offer a great opportunity for children and Parents to meet our new Early Years Lead and Assistant Headteacher, Mr Foster. After they have stayed for lunch Parents and Carers will leave the children to enjoy their afternoon learning with Mr Foster and the Early Years Team.

On Thursday, the children will start the day registering with their usual classes and will then move up to their new year groups after registration. For our current Nursery children they will come into school at the normal time of 12.30pm for their Nursery session.



## Our Governing Body Needs You!

Please see the message below from our previous Chair of Governors, Stuart Lewis. Stuart currently is responsible for curriculum on our Governing Body. In this piece he shares why Parents and Carers should definitely consider becoming a Governor at Tadcaster Primary Academy.



The last few years have seen enormous changes in our school: we've become an academy, we have changed head teacher, we have come through lock-down and we have had a new Early Years lead and Assistant Headteacher. That the school - pupils, parents and staff - has come through this is testimony to the resilience of everyone. I have been privileged to witness how everyone has coped with these changes and I have also been a minor player in ensuring that the school has remained unscathed and possibly stronger because it has coped.

I have been associated with Tadcaster East Community Primary School and now Tadcaster Primary Academy for a few years now as a governor. I have enjoyed that role hugely. I have learned an enormous amount: how primary schools work, are financed, set standards for pupils and staff, gain the confidence of the community they serve and above all, put children at the centre of all they do (often despite government edicts). Schools - and especially primary schools - are no longer solely about reading, writing and 'rithmetic: they are about the first stage of the development of children into responsible adult citizens able to fulfil their potential and who are curious about their world.

Where do governors fit into this grand scheme? Governors have the responsibility to hold schools to account - i.e. make sure they are doing what they say they are; ensure that public money is used to give the children the best possible education possible within financial constraints; and most importantly, work with and support staff in their unstinting efforts to make every child's time in school an enjoyable and fulfilling experience.

That maybe sounds as though to be governor, you need to be a pretty special person! You don't! The overriding qualification needed to be a governor - especially a parent governor - is a desire to contribute to all children in the community being given the opportunities and skills to grow to their maximum potential - and for them to enjoy doing it.

I'm stopping being a governor at TPA - only because I now spend a lot of my time away from the area. Would I be a governor again? Definitely! Would I be a governor at TPA again? Most certainly (if you'd have me!) Why don't you think of becoming a governor? Speak to Miss Towler or Mrs Lee (current Chair of Governors). You all have the essential qualification: you are a parent!
