This year's School Development Priorities


Every year our school focuses on priorities to help develop our school and make it even better. This year our three key priorities are:

Top tips on Computing from Mr Ramzan our Computing Lead

Ensure clear boundaries are in place about who your children are allowed to interact with online and that they only have access to websites that allow for this. This can be especially challenging when it comes to online games where it is all too easy for predators and scammers to find child age players and befriend them in order to obtain personal information or share inappropriate messages or content. Children should only be playing video games with people they know in real life - school friends or family members - and that parents are aware of.

Ensure social media accounts are set to private and only people they know are accepted as friends or contacts. Some social media websites will allow a profile to be "hidden" meaning that until a request is sent from your child's profile no one can find the profile on search engines or filtering through other friend lists. This can be helpful in preventing strangers online from sending requests to your children. Parents and carers should still, however, follow up requests to ensure that all friend requests are genuine, and generally closely monitor children's interactions on social media and messaging sites.
