Parking near school

Keeping safe near water

Recently, the children in all year groups took part in some online learning linked to keeping safe near water. The online drowning prevention assemblies were age appropriate and helped the children understand the dangers when being near open water. In a town with a river it is so

important that our children are educated on the risks of playing near or in rivers and streams.

With around 85% of accidental drownings occurring at open water sites, many occur due to the lack of knowledge and understanding of open water safety. Our children know that the shock of cold water can make swimming difficult and increase the difficulty in getting out of water. Also the depth of water is unpredictable and strong currents can rapidly sweep people away.



Take a look at some of our children's advice below:

'A red flag shown at the beach means 'Danger'' Olivia (Venus)

'Don't go to near to water as it can be dangerous, it can be dangerous because we don't know how deep it is.' Millie (Venus)

'We are not allowed to swim in reservoirs as in some places it is really deep.' Harry (Venus)

'Call 999 if there is an emergency a red flag means NO SWIMMING!' Payton (Jupiter)

'Spot the danger near a canal because it is not safe. You don't know how deep it is.' Amir (Jupiter)
