

## Trust School Review

On Monday we welcomed a team from Ebor Academy Trust into school. The team were overwhelmingly positive and shared some lovely feedback. I am really proud of the whole team for all their hard work and wish to celebrate every single member of the staff



along with the children for their commitment and hard work. Please see below for some of the highlights. We will share more feedback next week.

Behaviour and wellbeing was evaluated as outstanding. Children demonstrated excellent learning behaviours and showed respect to one another ~

'Children speak with passion and pride when it comes to describing the values around behaviour and wellbeing, they feel confident in understanding what the school does to keep them safe both inside and outside of school. 'Children are clear about behaviour expectations and understand systems — they reflect on the impact of restorative practice and circles and appreciate its impact on ensuring everyone is happy at the school.'

Early Years provision was assessed as outstanding - the quality of Maths teaching was identified as a particular strength.

'Children are active learners who are invested in their own learning. Routines are clear and well–established. The environment in Early Years was language rich with a 'We Love Story' book celebrating reading and story.'

Personal development was recognised by the team as a strength ~

'Children are aware of the 5 keys to wellbeing and can verbalise them, reflecting on the impact on their lives. They report that there is no bullying in the school. They feel that everyone is kind and looks after each other.' 'Equal opportunities are promoted and most children understand why this is prioritised at the school. They speak of responsibilities they are provided with such as Pupil Parliament and Sports Leaders.'
